The Oregon Reading Association will again choose one school to represent Oregon for the International Reading Association's Exemplary School Award.

The winning school will receive:

- \$500.00 to use for a literacy project plus lots of favorable publicity locally and statewide.
- Three paid registrations for the ORA Annual Conference to be held February 4-5, 2011.
- Free one-year ORA memberships or renewals for the ENTIRE certified staff.
- An invitation to present at the ORA Annual Conference, February 4-5, 2011. (not required)
- An invitation to present at the 56th IRA Annual Convention in Orlando, FL, May 8-11, 2011. (not required)

Criteria:

- All public and private elementary and secondary schools are eligible if the school has at least one IRA member.
- The school must apply with its entire reading program, not just one segment, such as Title I, library/media.
- The application form must be signed by the chief school officer, e.g., the superintendent.
- The winning program should serve as a model for other schools and teachers.
