An art activity for *Surprising Sharks*. Let each student make a crayon resist showing a shark of their choice in an ocean environment.

Directions:

First sketch in the scene. Then color with crayons, pressing hard so the colors and objects show up. Next use a watercolor or watered-down blue-green tempera paint to paint over the whole page.



An art activity for *Stanley's Party*. Let students use construction paper or other stiff paper to cut out a dog's body shape, head, legs, ears, nose, and tail. They can cut out eyes or glue on wiggly eyes. The other parts can be attached with glue or brads. Using brads will make the dogs able to dance at the party. Smaller brads might work better than those shown.
